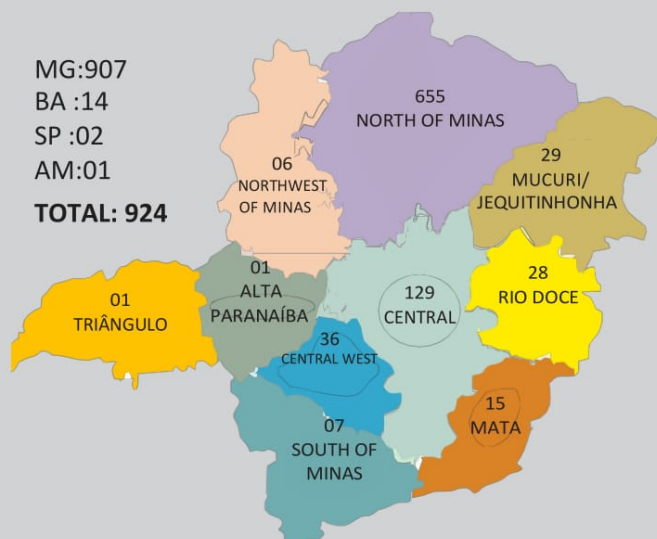
For the last 18 years we have supported 924 children and teenagers, 79 of them registered in 2016.

Aiming to provide the families with everything they need and to raise awareness about and improvement in childhood cancer treatment, we have organized our work in 11 programs, as listed below:

Together in Treatment Program



We invested **R\$108,779.55** to restore the **procedure room** of Santa Casa Hospital's pediatric ward, using the proceeds from Mchappy Day 2014.

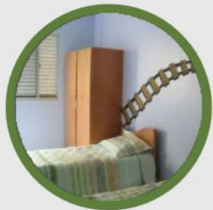
We also invested **R\$60,523.00** in a **research** to build up a profile of the child and teenager with cancer in the North of Minas, as well as manage epidemiologic data, clinical markers and therapeutic protocols. The research started in November, 2016 and it was also sponsored by the donations from Mchappy Day campaign.

Well-Nourished Program



We provided:
17,372 meals;
16,665 snacks;
961 special food baskets;
1,485 dietary supplements.

We also made 107 individualized nutrition interventions and conducted over 30 seminars, group activities and menu planning meetings.



Shelter Program

We offered **10,542 rooms** to accommodate children and teenagers with cancer and their companions.



Driving Important People Program

466 children and companions had free transportation to and from hospitals, medical laboratories and other centers.



Knowledge Can Heal Program

We offered **38 training courses to 775 healthcare professionals** and undergraduate students, and **113 seminars to an audience of 1,668 people**.



Optimizing Program

We invested **R\$24,780.00 to speed up exam results** and diagnosis for 52 children and teenagers.



New Home, New Life Program

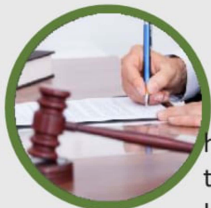
Our social services sector was responsible for helping provide rent assistance **for four families**.



Holding Hands Program

We gave:
1.402 medicines;
184 high-cost medical exams;
16 catheters and prostheses

R\$198,244.00 were invested in **medication, high-cost exams, medical appointments, catheters, funeral assistance, among other services**.



Access to Their Rights Program

We count on the judicial system to help us acquire high-cost medications that are not covered by the Brazilian Unified Health System (SUS) assistance. With that help we were able to get a **R\$174,400.00 grant in 2016. We also got a R\$26,000.00 grant from Brazilian Continued Payment Benefit (Benefício de Prestação Continuada – BPC)**.



Emotional Health Program

We held:
2,269 social assistance consultations;
686 psychology appointments;
137 home and hospital visitations;
242 group activities and workshops.



Moving On Program

We held **1,112 hours of school lessons** for children under treatment, as well as extracurricular activities, parent-teacher meetings and other activities that help the assisted children keep up with their normal routine.

In addition to the income we receive from our associates in a regular basis, we can also count on occasional donations of resources, products and services, as well as the proceeds from events and campaigns we organize on our own or with the help from other associates. Some examples of such events and campaigns are the **“Campanha Imposto de Renda do Bem”, McDia Feliz (Mchappy Day), the “Circuito Rodeio de Barretos em Montes Claros”, the “Noite Solidária” and the “Exposição de Arte Solidária”**.
